WA Water Award winners announced during National Water Week

29 October 2018

The Western Australian water industry celebrated National Water Week with the announcement of the 2018 WA Water Award winners at last Friday's WA Water Awards Dinner.

Australian Water Association Chief Executive, Jonathan McKeown attended the awards dinner and congratulated all finalists and winners for their positive contribution to the sector and the wider community.

"The entire Association congratulates and recognises the professionals and organisations who are truly making a difference to the water sector in Western Australia," Mr McKeown said.

The WA Water Awards aim to recognise the contribution of the Association's members for their leadership and their innovative programs, research or infrastructure projects.

The winners of this year's WA Water Awards will automatically be entered into the equivalent National Australian Water Awards category, which will be presented at Ozwater'19 in Melbourne, 7-9 May 2019.

Program Innovation Award

Revitalising Geographe Waterways – Department of Water and Environmental Regulation

The Revitalising Geographe Waterways program was delivered in partnership with the City of Busselton and Geographe Catchment Council. The program has improved water quality, waterway health, and management of Geographe waterways by establishing collaborative frameworks across government, industry, scientists, and the community to develop and deliver actions to improve water quality.

Research Innovation Award

Self-Regulating Suspended Biogas Collector Technology – Environmental Engineers International

Environmental Engineers International undertook a research project to review the gas capturing technology available to the market, and design and construct a new solution. The result was a unique modular design system, innovative in reactor and lagoon covering technology. The system has a wide application for effectively capturing gases for energy generation, odour prevention and operation safety.

Groundwater Replenishment Scheme - Water Corporation

As the first water project of its kind in Australia, the Groundwater Replenishment Scheme has made a significant contribution to the country's long-term security of water supplies by creating a new climate-independent water source and increasing the capacity to safely and efficiently recycle water.

Grahame Heal Water Sensitive Urban Design Award

Rosehill Waters - Stage 1 - Coterra Environment

Rosehill Waters is a residential development with sustainability at its heart. An innovative water management strategy has been achieved, which takes advantage of the unique existing environmental opportunities present at the site. Rosehill Waters was developed by Noahs Rosehill Waters with hydrology and environmental expertise provided by Coterra Environment.

Innovating for Sustainable Water and Environmental Outcomes (Award sponsored by Water Corporation & Department of Water and Environmental Regulation)

Self Cleaning Automatic Filter Backflush for the Greyflow Greywater Diversion System –

Advanced Waste Water Systems

Advanced Waste Water Systems' has developed an economical self-cleaning mechanism for gravity flow applications. The invention took four years to develop and provides a safe, hygienic and maintenance free means of filtering and diverting greywater for garden re-use. The system is fit for use for both household and larger commercial settings and helps to reduce overall water consumption.

Student Water Prize (Award sponsored by GHD)

Renewable Energy Reverse Osmosis Desalination in a Small Rural Village in Indonesia: Case Study – Tom Wheeler, Murdoch University

Tom is a dedicated Environmental Engineering student at Murdoch University. Tom has completed overseas and domestic internships, and takes on multiple volunteering opportunities to share his passion for innovative solutions for environmental problems. His project aims to benefit communities that are facing a limited supply of potable water. The project provides a detailed optimisation of renewable energy, seawater reverse osmosis desalination, to enable a sustainable water supply that is viable through renewable energy.

Young Water Professional of the Year Award (Award sponsored by TRILITY) Kate Bowker, Senior Technical Advisor - Wastewater Recycling, Water Corporation

Kate is a passionate Young Water Professional whose commitment to Water Corporation for the past 8 years extends far beyond their internal walls. Kate has predominately worked in the wastewater recycling space but has also held roles in asset management and it is her ability to develop key relationships with external stakeholders across multiple spheres of influence that has driven much of her success. She has also been an active member of the AWA WA Committee since 2011 and has recently been involved in the reinvigorated local WaterAid Committee. Kate has made a significant impact to the Western Australian water sector, particularly excelling when organising networking and professional development opportunities for WA water professionals.
